The cover page features the photo of women from the well-known Lambani community. Settled in Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra, the Lambani (Banjara) community is known for its crafts especially intricate embroidery. Sandur Lambani embroidery features over 30 stitches and 10 motifs, using cotton or khadi fabric dyed with organic or chemical colors. Embellished with mirrors and shells, it decorates sarees, bags and shawls. Red and blue are the most used colors. Traditionally worn during ceremonies, this vibrant craft symbolizes identity and pride for Lambani women.

VARIJA GALLERY

SEPT. 21 - DEC. 28 : 'THREADS OF CONFLUENCE' EXHIBITION

Chennai's iconic Madras checks lightweight cotton once shipped across colonial trade routes — are in the limelight in the Threads of Confluence exhibition. The exhibition reimagines the fabric's global journey and brings Madras cloth into dialogue with curator Anitha Reddy's community art practice with the creative practices of the Siddi community of Karnataka, descendants of Africans displaced into India.



From Fort St. George, Madras cloth travelled to Africa, the Caribbean and America, renamed and reinterpreted in each context: Injiri cloth in West Africa, national dress in the Caribbean, and even preppy fashion in the United States. The Siddis, in contrast, embody a story of inward displacement, arriving in India through slavery, war and trade. Over centuries, Siddi women transformed local patchwork and appliqué traditions into their own expressive form.

This exhibition presents textile panels made from contemporary scraps of Madras Checks, generously donated by The Original Madras Trading Company. These works are not only striking visual compositions but also carriers of memory, survival, and adaptation. They stitch together histories of fabric and people, routes and roots, displacement and resilience.

Curated and facilitated by community art practitioner Anitha N Reddy, Threads of Confluence transforms textiles into living archives—where women's everyday making becomes both testimony and art.



By animating the *Katamaraju Katha* within the Ikat House, DakshinaChitra celebrates the timeless strength of folk art in preserving culture.

It also talks about her family, her tours to the U.S. and how she helped change people's view of Bharatanatyam. Knight writes with great respect and gives readers a close look at her dedication, her struggles with society and her strong personality. This book is a powerful tribute to a legendary dancer. It shows how one woman protected and promoted a beautiful Indian art form with courage, love and talent. A must-read for lovers of art, culture and Indian classical dance.
